"I ran outside with two of my friends," witness Dieter Walton told KRON 4's Jeff Bush. "The driver was hanging out the front seat just bleeding, unconscious. Me and my two friends went in and unhooked him from the seatbelt."

Investigators say before the truck hit the wall it smashed into a van owned by Catherine Nakahara's business.

"We have a van and a showroom, so now we don't have a van," Nakahara
