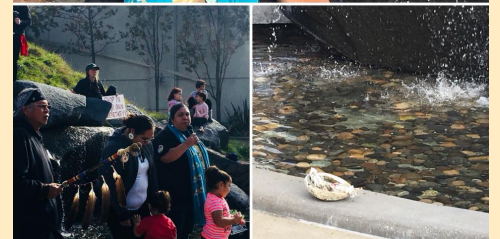

Tribal Chair Gould will discuss the colonization of the Ohlone people on the lands of the Bay Area, including the continued invisibilization and resilience of the Tribe in current times.

She will share the sacred landscape hidden beneath the urbanization of the Lisjan territory, work that is currently being done to bring light to the desecration of sacred sites, and the cultural revitalization of her Tribe through the creation of the Sogorea Te' Land Trust.
